There will be first, second and third awards given -- for the funniest, smallest, biggest, prettiest, fattest, oldest, youngest, most unusual and for the most tricks.

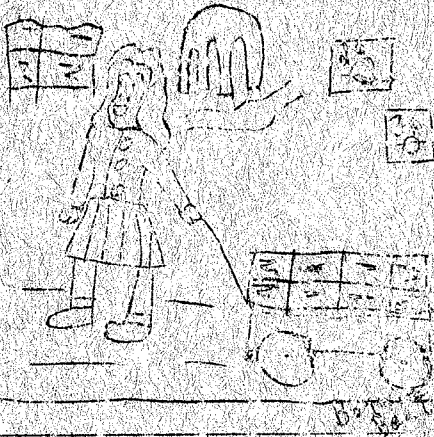

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## CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS

On October 12 we celebrate Columbus Day in honor of Christopher Columbus who discovered America in 1492.

Columbus discovered America under the Spanish flag but he was a native of Italy. He was born near Genoa.

From early boyhood he had a taste for adventure and a desire to explore new lands. In 1479 he came into possession of maps and papers which confirmed his opinion that the continent of Asia could be reached by sailing westward.

He had spent years as a seaman on voyages to England, the Canaries, Guianas and other countries.

He worked for many years trying to raise enough money to support his belief that the world was round and not flat. He went from wealthy individuals to business concerns but no one in Italy would advance the money.

Later he went to Spain and there by the aid of Ferdinand and Isabella, king and queen of Spain, he was able to start on the voyage to prove the world was round instead of flat. On August 3, 1490 with a small fleet he set sail on his long sea voyage and landed October 12, 1492 on the Bahama Islands.

## "NAVY DAY"

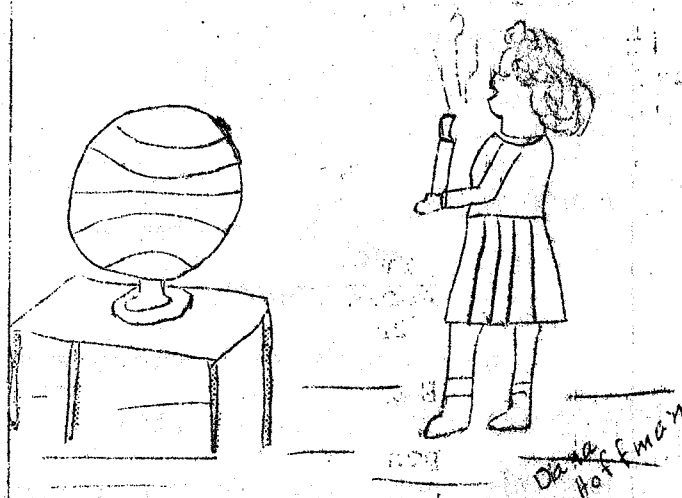
Navy Day is observed October 27. The first American Navy was started during the Revolutionary War.

## SIXTH GRADE TEACHER

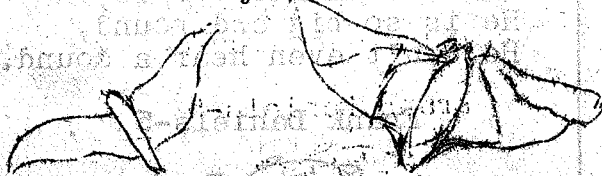

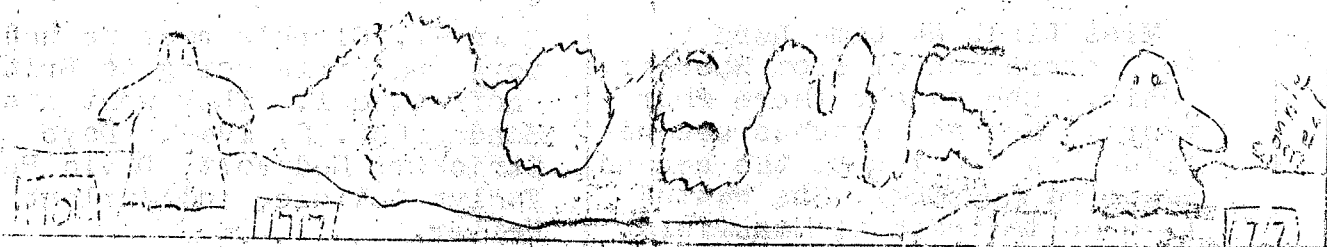

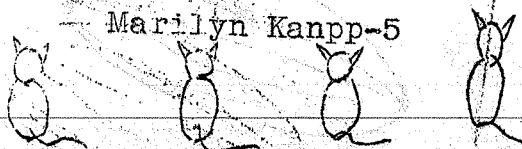

The three mill levy is not a new tax. It is a continuation of the same tax we have had for several years.

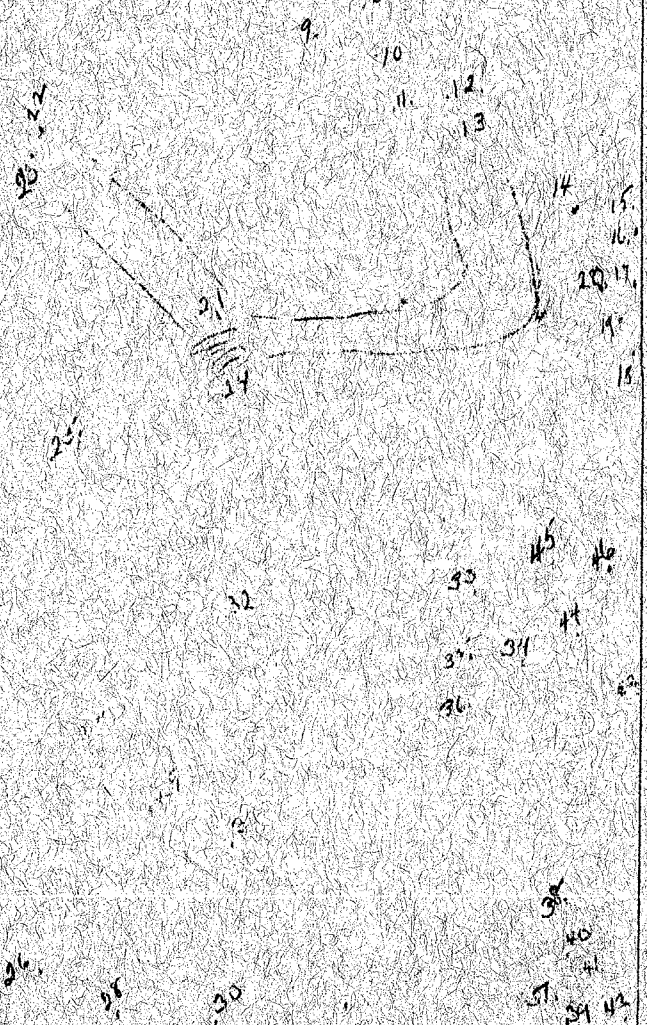
