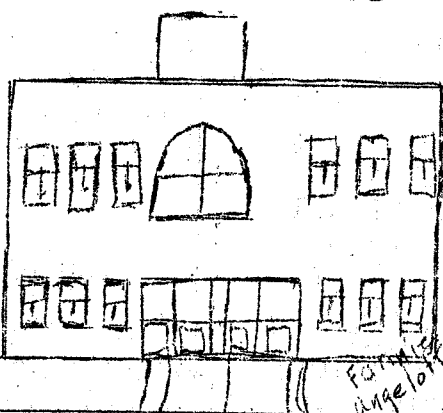
BOND AND STAMP SALE

SCHOOL BOND ISSUE

The cost of the elementary building program in the whole city is \$2,111,000.

Mansfield needs new grade school buildings. The average age of the grade schools is about 63 years.

There will be a new building built at the corner of Springmill and Trimble road and there will be one at the corner of Euclid and Highland avenue.

A new 12-room building is planned for the Roseland area.

Newman will be replaced by a 10-room building.

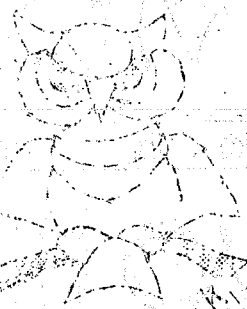
Eleven rooms will be added to the new section of the Hedges building, and two rooms to Woodland school.

Four rooms plus modern toilet facilities, a clinic, a library, will be added to Western, Carpenter and Brinkerhoff will be abandoned and a new 12-room building will be constructed on a new site located between the present site of these two buildings.

When you cross the street at a

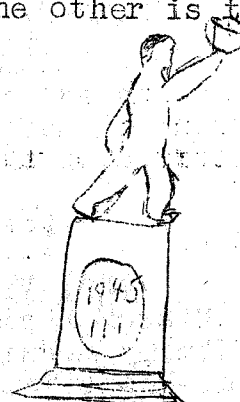
stop-light you walk across when it is red and when it is green you stop.

Bowman will be replaced by a new 26-room building.

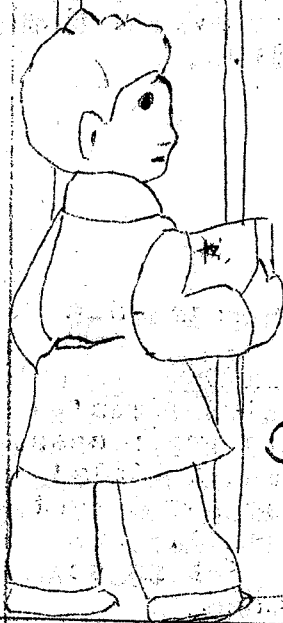
All grade school building will have a combination auditorium-gymnasium.

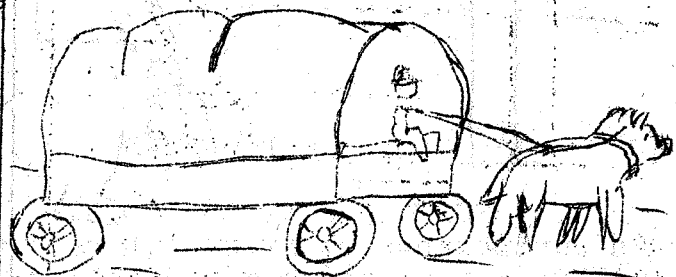
at the game.

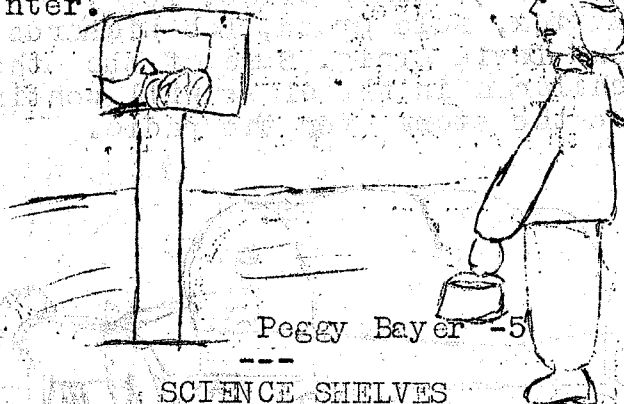
INSECT COLLECTION

JUNIOR AUDUBON CLUB

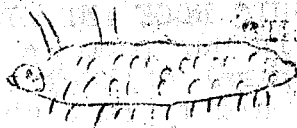

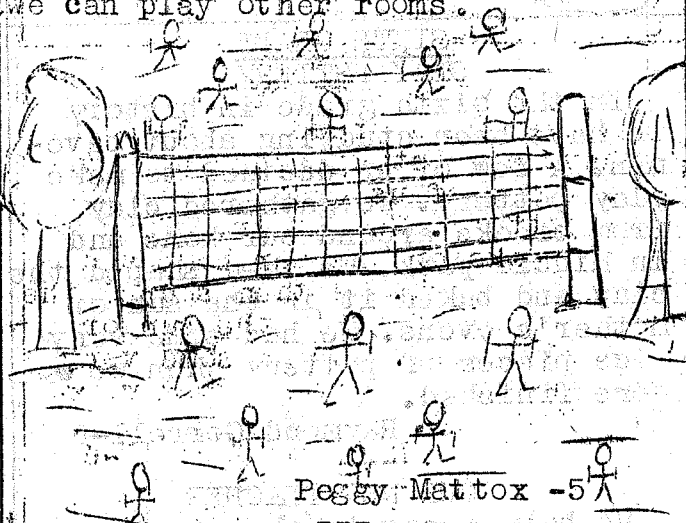
Mattox, secretary. We have notebooks too. The name we have on them is "Exploring the Bible."
