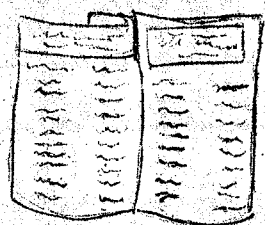


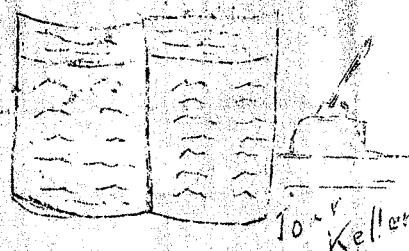

We want to thank Mrs. Walker for giving us things to do at the party. We want to thank Mr. Clark for letting us have the party. We hope everybody will have a good time.

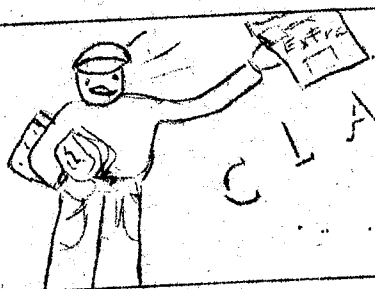

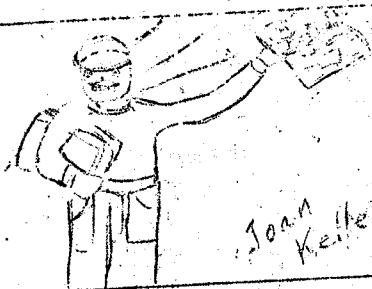

## JURY

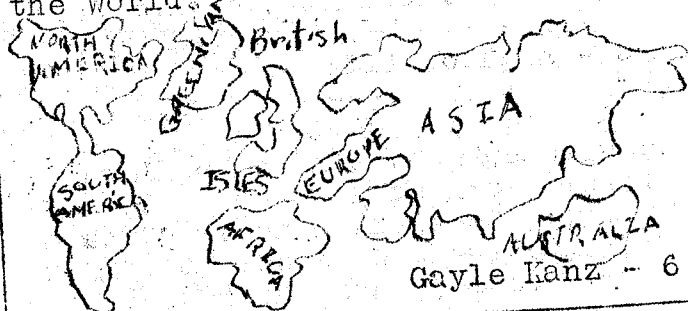

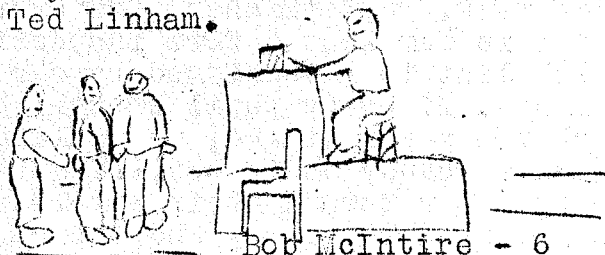

Our room is going to have a Safety play. It is going to be held in Miss Miles' room on October 26. The play is about cases in court. The cases are careless children.

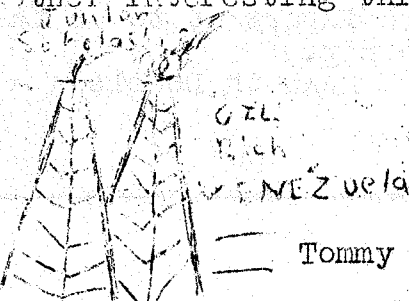

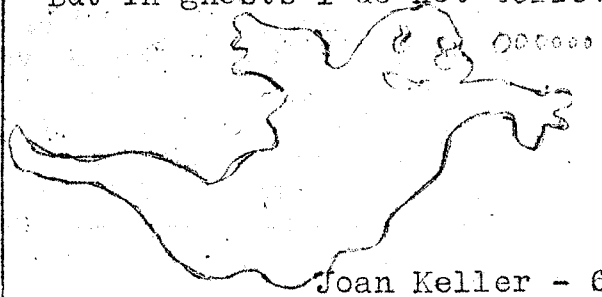
## NEW GYM
