

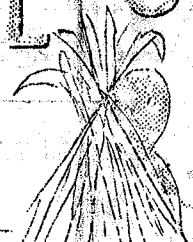
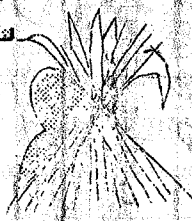

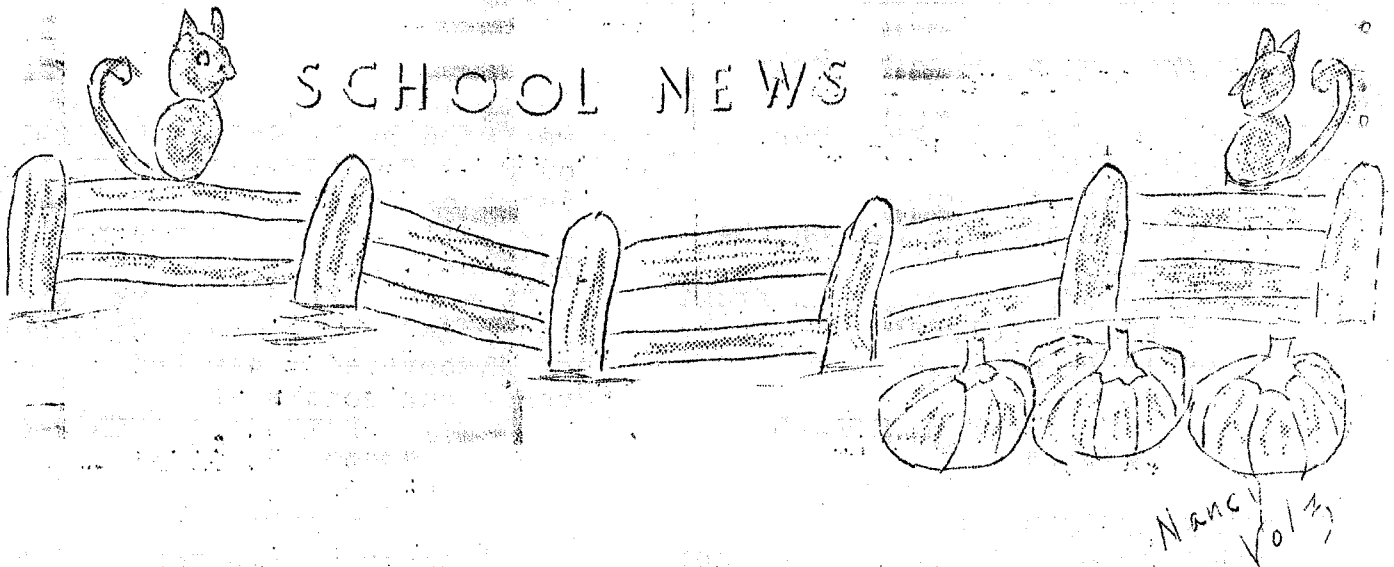
## OUR NEW PRINCIPAL

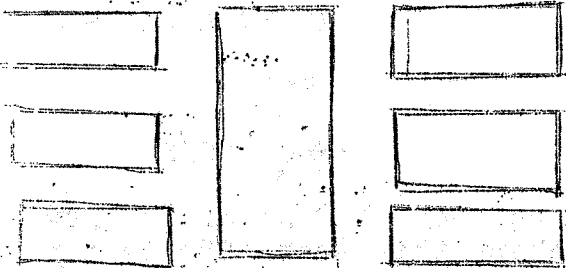

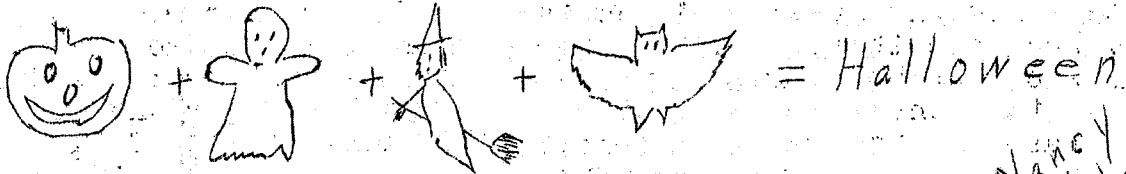

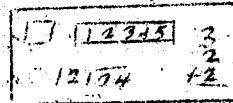
FOLDERS

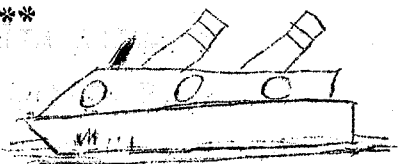
## BOAT MODELS
