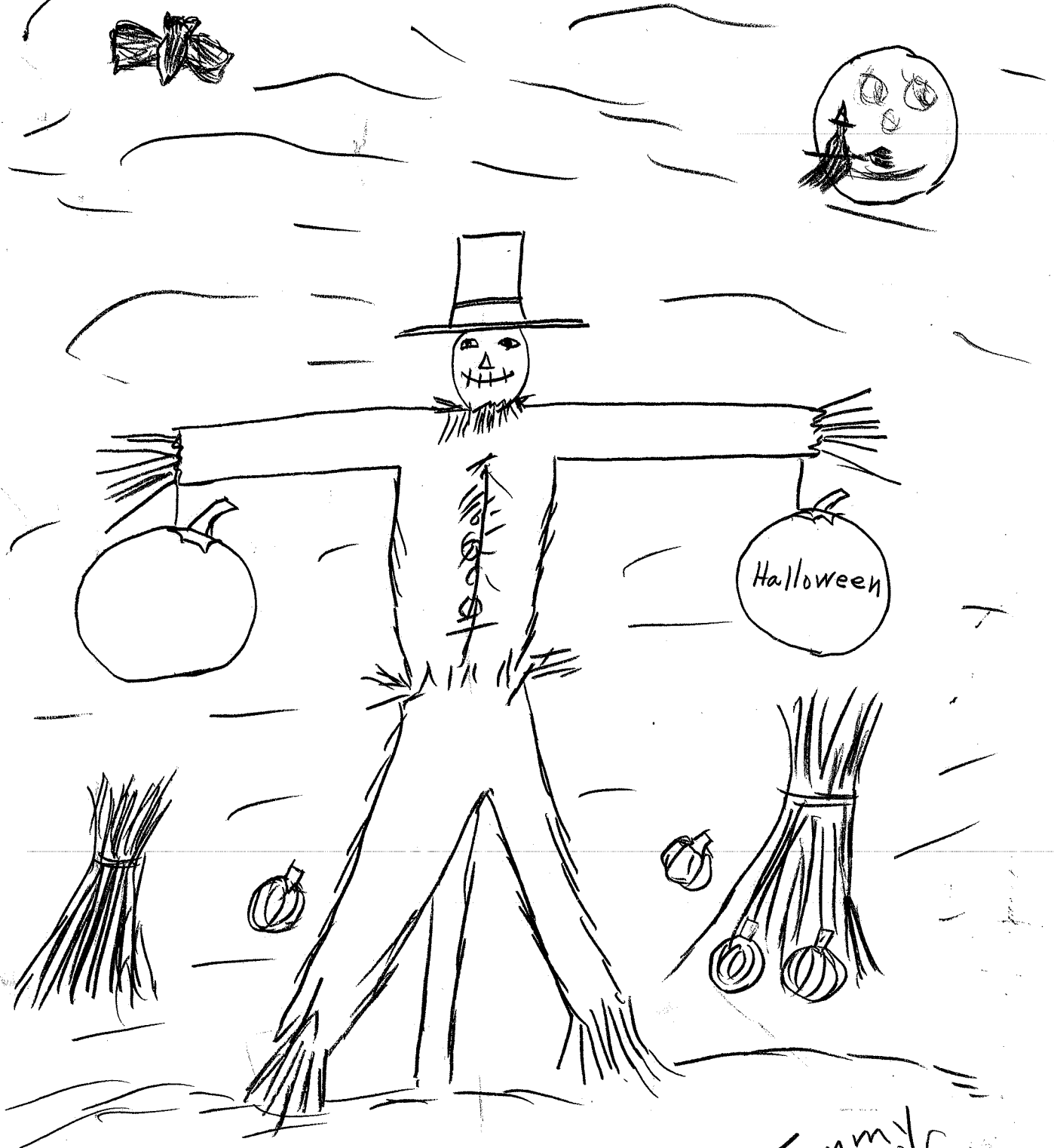

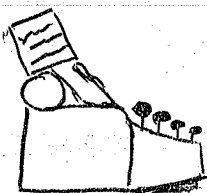

how the shelf mushrooms  
grow. We learned that  
they start from a spore

spore begins to grow.  
Then the mushroom plants  
spread through the tree.  
The spores grow on the  
shelf. The shelf grows  
bigger each year. The  
shelf is a little like  
the fruit tree. It does  
not hurt to break a  
shelf off.

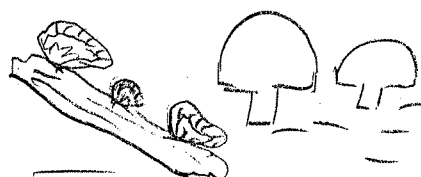
## WESTERN WINDUP

### ALL ABOUT CAVES

There are caves all over the earth. There are five principal kinds of caves: wind caves, wave caves, lava caves, ice caves and limestone caves.

Wind caves are made in mountainsides where the wind blows almost without stopping. Here small pieces of grit and sand are swept along with such force that they grind deep hollows into soft spots in the rock.

Wave caves are made in seaside cliffs by waves beating against soft places and gradually wearing large holes. Wave caves are often called sea caves, but there is another kind of sea cave that is found under water. Divers report that sea caves are wonderful places filled with beautiful strange fish and plants.

Lava caves are made by a melted liquid rock which pours from an active volcano. As it flows away from the volcano it cools and hardens. First it becomes solid on the surface, though it may still be soft underneath. Sometimes the soft liquid lava bursts out at the end of

the flow and runs from under the hardened crust. The hollow which is left is called a lava cave.

Ice caves are made entirely of ice. They are found in the Arctic and Antarctic areas or in mountainous regions of everlasting snow, such as the high Pyrenees in Spain or the Alps in Switzerland. These ice caves have beautiful frozen waterfalls.

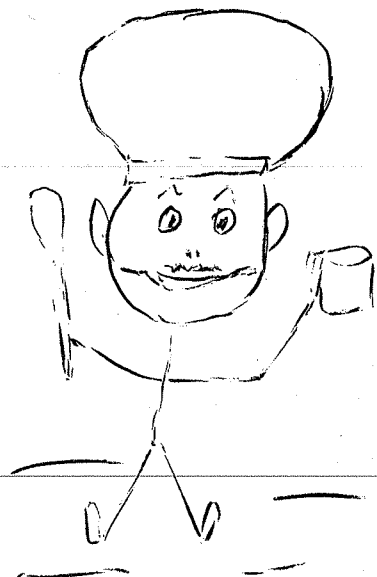
1 can (No. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ) solid pack tomatoes

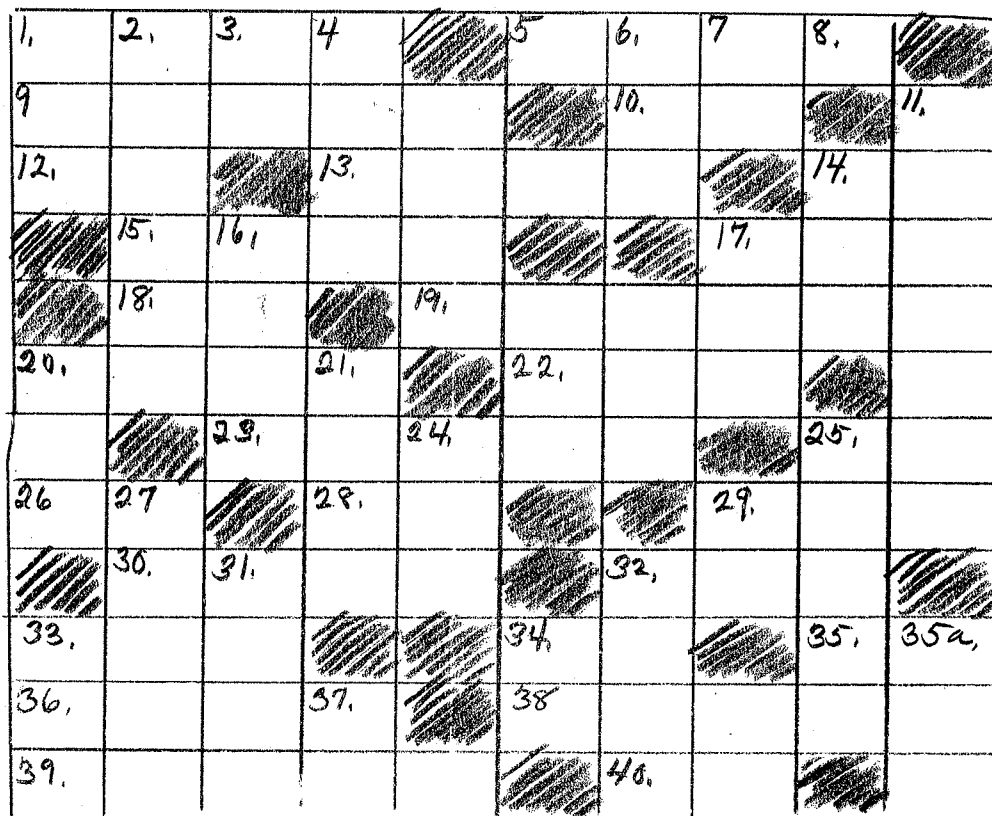
