LINOTYPE

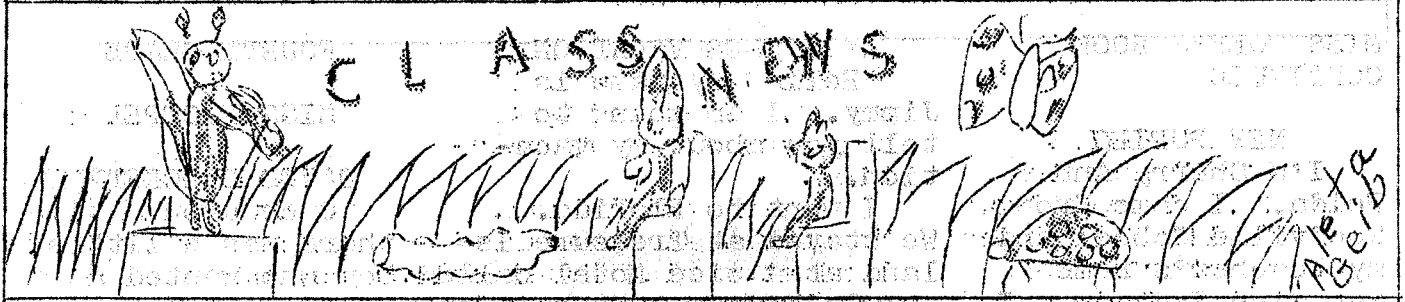
Ottmar Merqenthaler invented the Linotype in 1880. If we did not have a Linotype, we would not have books, newspapers, magazines or our Western Wind Up.

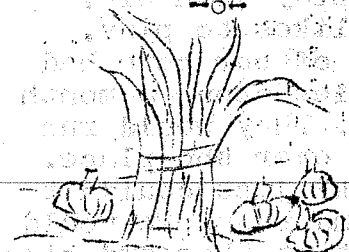
CHOCOLATE COOKIES
