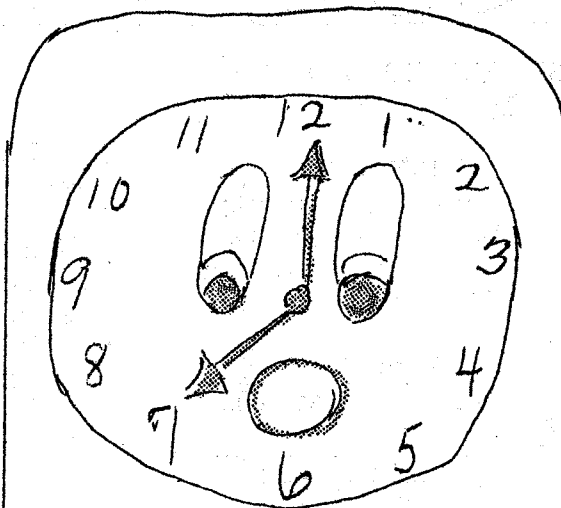

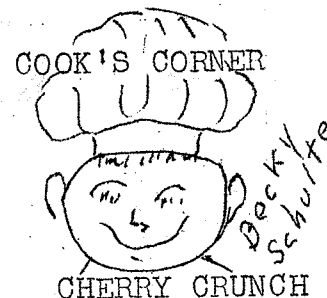

NATIONAL PARK STUDY

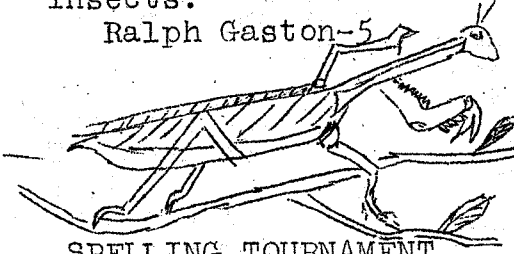

ME AND THE GIANT

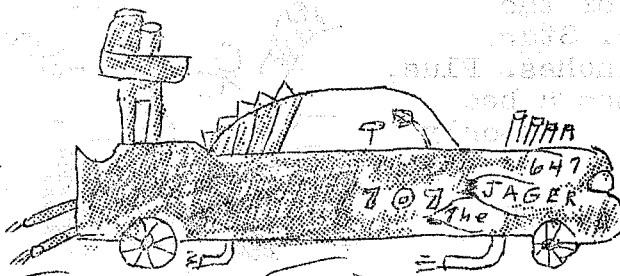

Columbus Day honors the day Christopher Columbus discovered America. It is celebrated on October 12, a legal holiday throughout the United States.

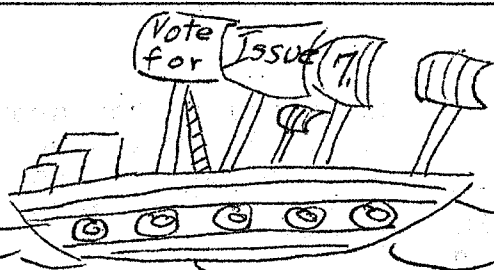

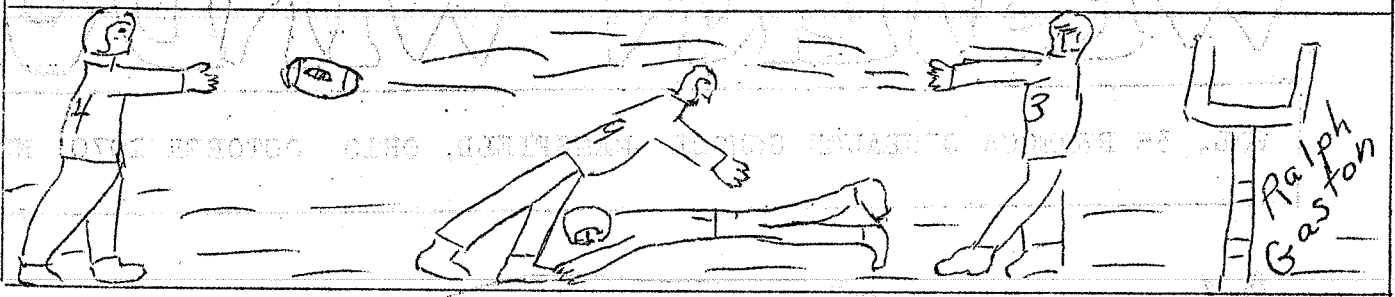
HALLOWEEN
