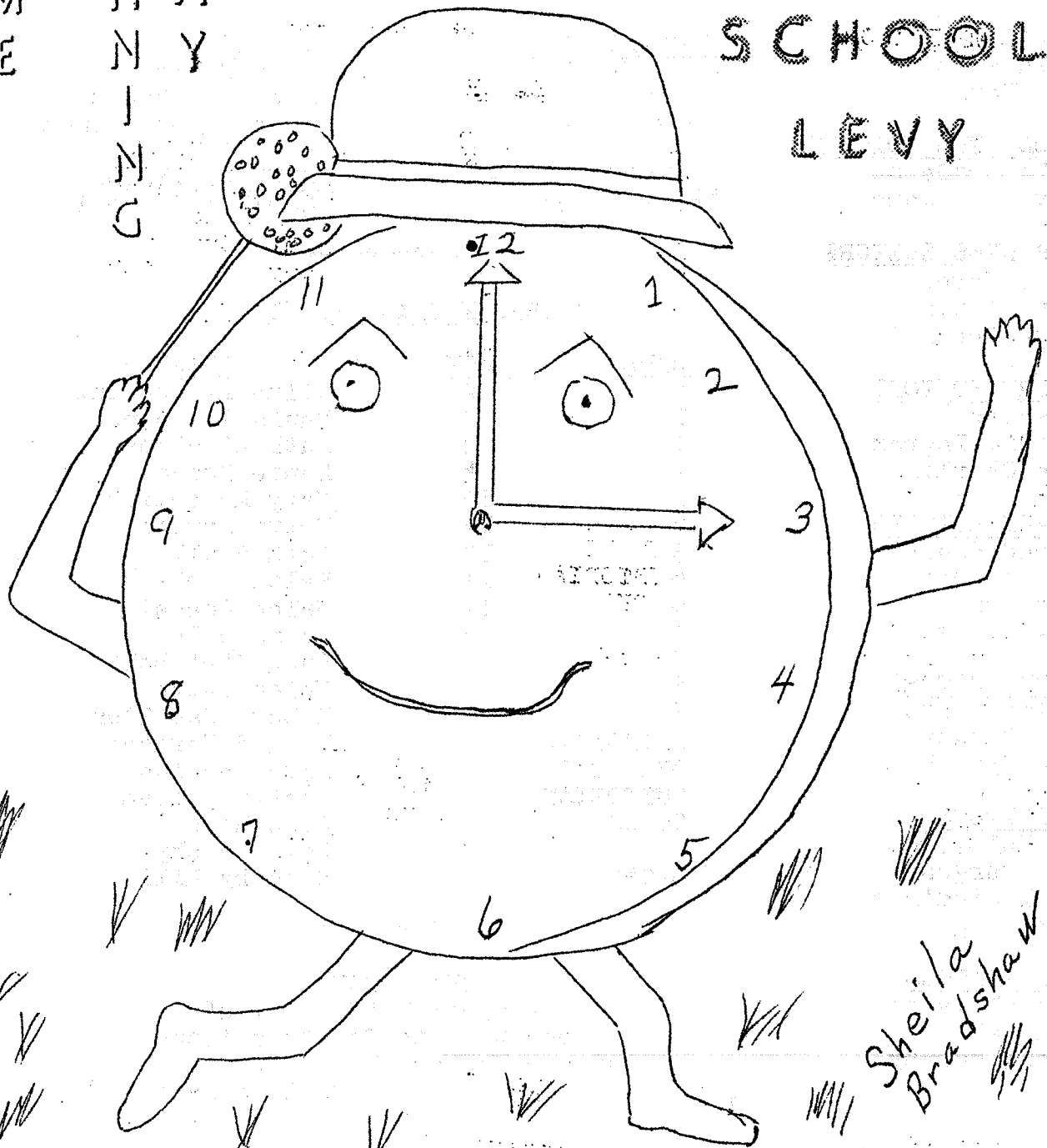

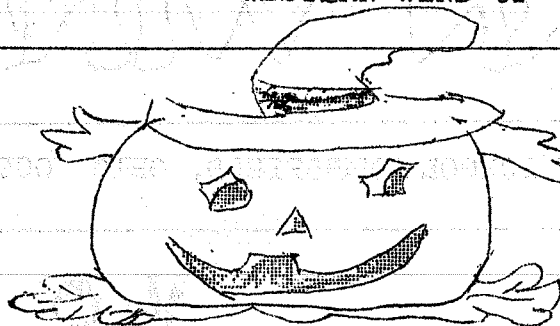

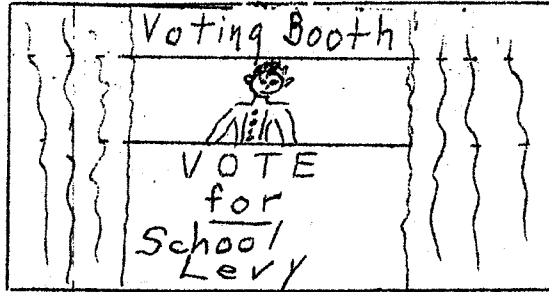

of

Traci Hall with Mr. Hofacre. These are the important Facts About Emergency of The Mansfield City Schools-2.9 Mill Levy, as told by Mr. Hofacre.

1. Local funds will be exhausted on or before December 10, 1971.-based on the State Auditor's report.

2. The state legislature has made a political football out of school finances, and you can be sure that the state will not give the schools enough money to operate even a minimum program.

3. The state has said that schools must accept next year's money to stay open. This is fine for this year but what about next year?

4. The Mansfield Board of Education has reduced their request to the absolute minimum and is asking for the money for two years. This money is needed no matter what the state gives, in order to keep the present austerity program in operation.

5. If the levy passes, the Board can borrow against the anticipated income in order to keep the schools open after December 10.

6. The Mansfield schools have been and still are providing your children with a good education.

7. If you don't believe it, contact some of the colleges where hundreds of Mansfield graduates are now attending.

8. The schools have tightened their belts during the financial crisis. Jobs have been eliminated, one building has been closed, certain courses have been dropped-in fact the operation cost has been cut by over \$600,000.00 in 1971-72.

9. The Mansfield schools tax rate of 35.20 mills is not the highest in Richland County. Look at these figures: Plymouth 46.50, Clearfork 44.30, Lucas 42.10, Crestview 40.90, Lexington 39.90, Shelby 35.30. Furthermore, outside of the county look at these rates: Sandusky 38.35, Wooster 38.10 Canton 37.50, Elyria 36.85, Hamilton 36.65, Springfield 36.20, Lorain 36.14, Warren 35.50, Massillon 35.40.

10. The money you spend to educate your children is the wisest investment you will ever make.

11. To the critic who "cries" mismanagement of money--say prove it.

12. Certainly the schools have some problem children, but for every bad one there are 100 good ones. Give these kids a break and.....

Mrs. Rheinboldt taught at Creveling and Wooster Heights before she came to Grubaugh.

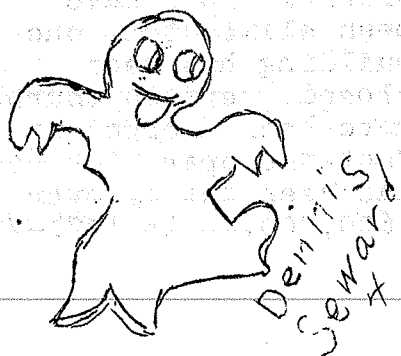

THE EAGLE

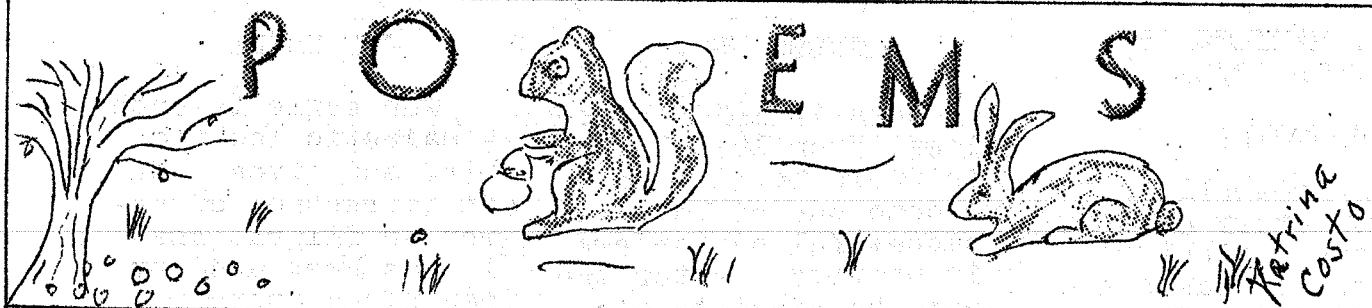
