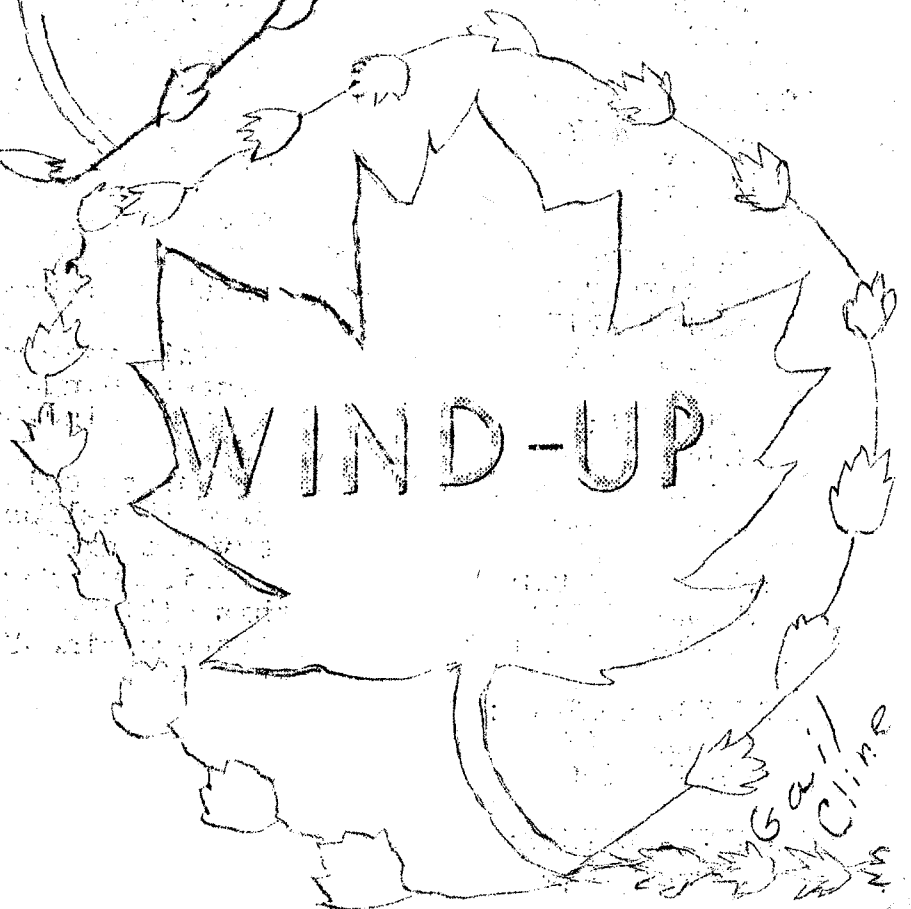
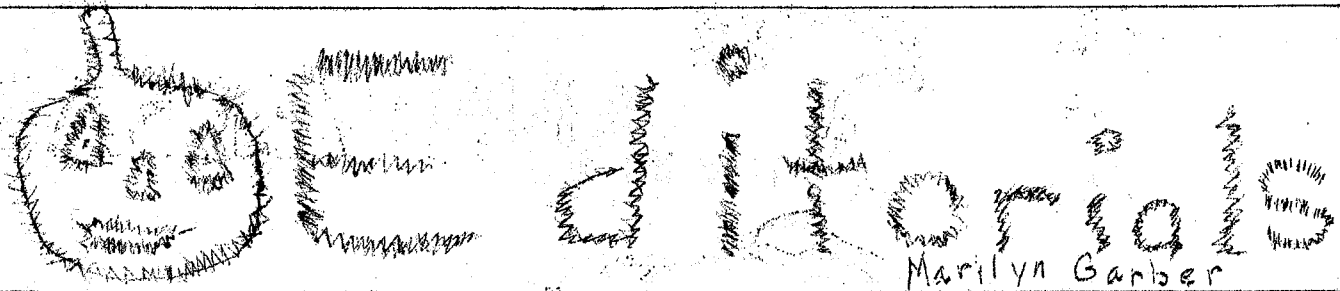

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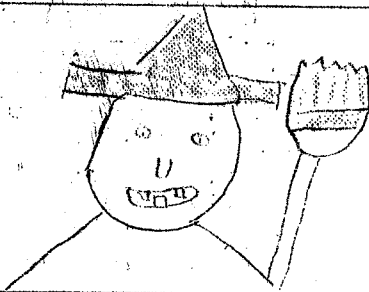
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25th ANNIVERSARY of the WESTERN WIND-UP

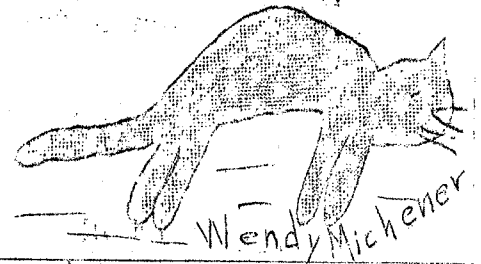
This year will be our 25th year for the Western Wind-Up. We have been having the Western Wind-Up for 25 years.

This Saturday we are going around putting cards on door handles. The cards say, "Please Vote."

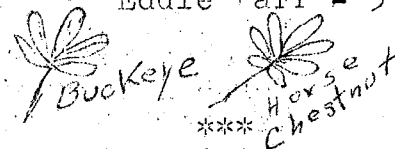

HALLOWEEN

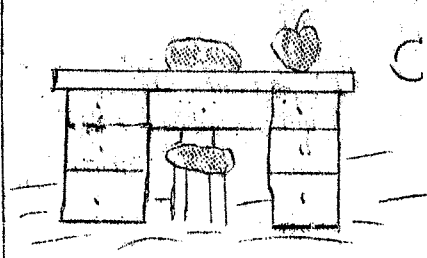

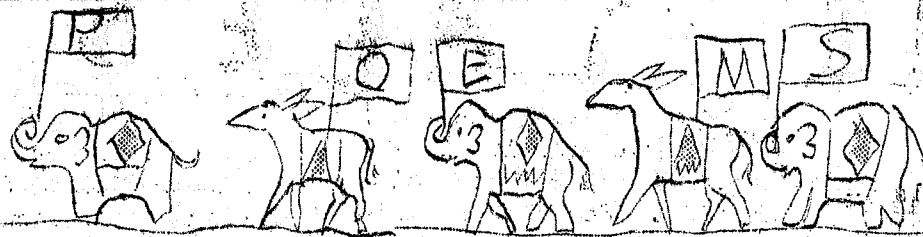
Once there were two boys named Jack and Jim. They found a treasure map. Jack and Jim packed their packs with food and clothing and started out to find the treasure.

CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS

Columbus had little
schooling but was very
alert. Columbus was
born between August
25 and October 31,
1451, in Genoa, then
the capital of an in-
dependent Italian re-
public. No record was
left about what sort
of boy Columbus was,
but judging from his
later life, he was

the dreamy, sensitive kind, rather than a 'regular' fellow. The chance to go to sea came some time between his nineteenth and twentieth birthdays, when he shipped aboard a Genoese galley. The galley had been chartered by King Rene of Provence to punish the Barbary pirates. After that Columbus made one or two voyages to the island of Chios in the Aegean Sea. Then came a voyage that almost cost him his life. His ship, the Bechalla, formed part of a convoy bound from Genoa to England. On August 12, 1476, the convoy was attacked by a hostile fleet off Lagos, Portugal. Columbus was wounded and his ship sank. Jumping into the sea, he grabbed a long oar as a life preserver, he managed to reach shore. A few months later he was on a Portuguese vessel which stopped at Galway in Ireland. The vessel sailed in February, 1471, before returning to Lisbon.

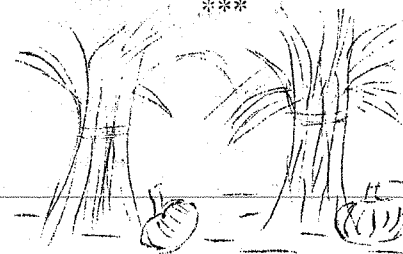

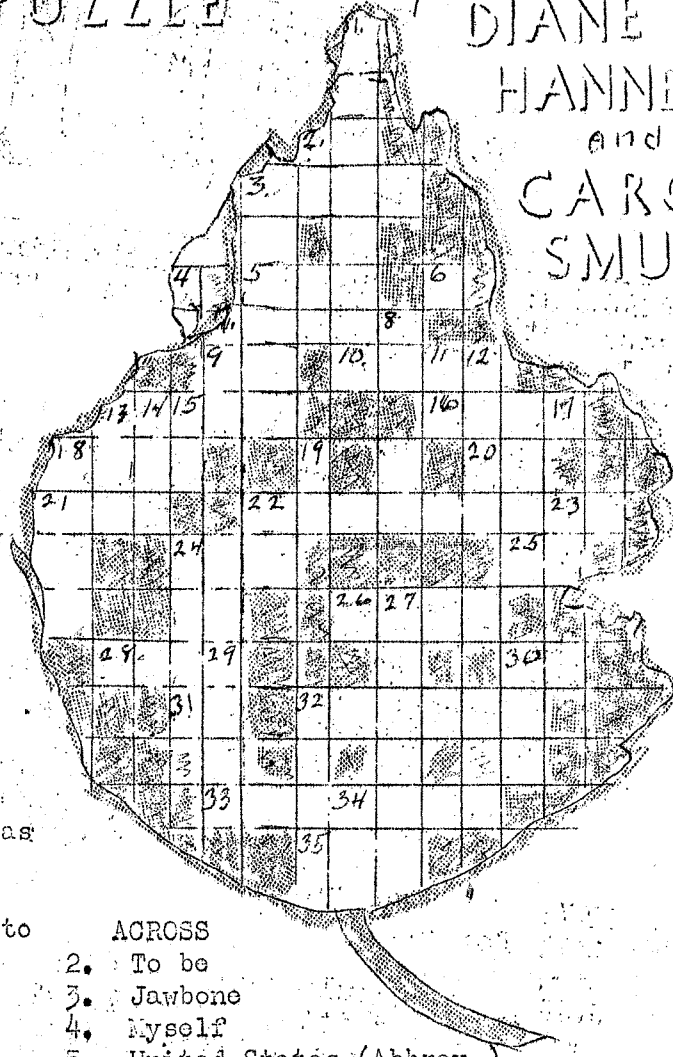

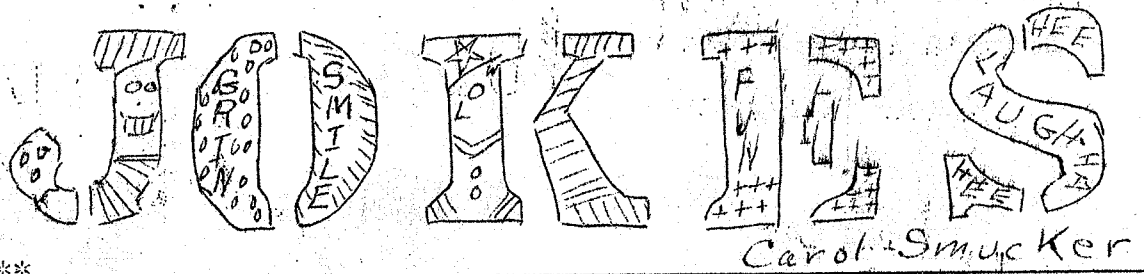
