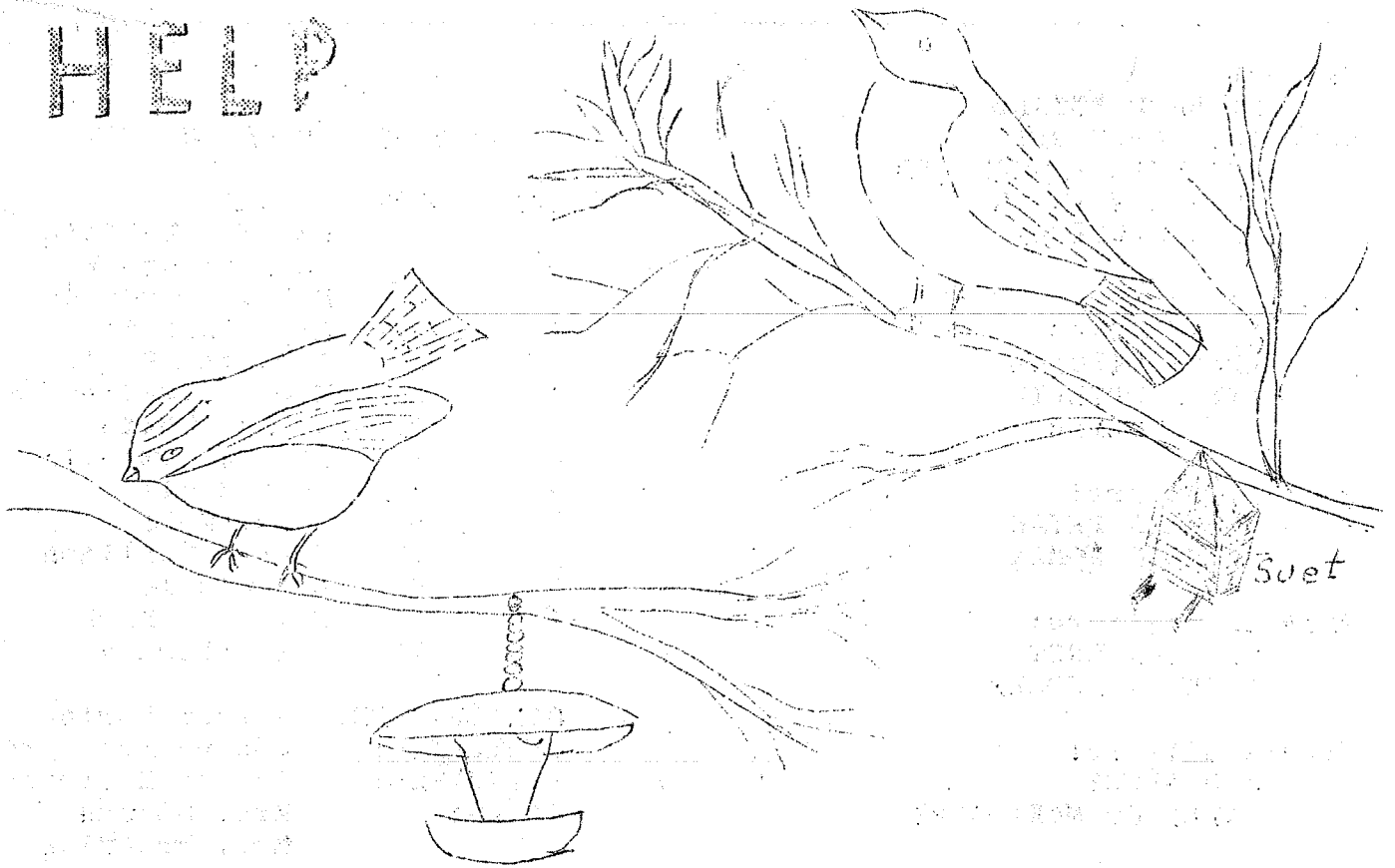

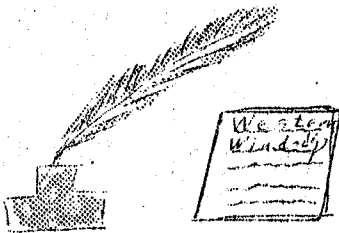

Valentines, gifts of flowers and candy are still given by men to women in celebration of Saint Valentine's Day. American school children exchange valentines and sometimes have parties.

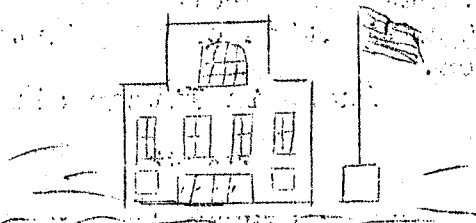

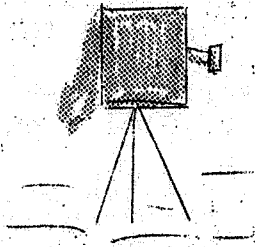
## TUMBLING SHOW

On February 2, some of the boys and girls of Grubaugh School are going to Ashland College to take part in a tumbling show.

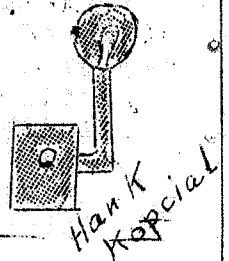
A basketball game is to be played by college teams. At the half we will tumble for them. The half will be at 8:30 P. M. There will be twelve of us there.

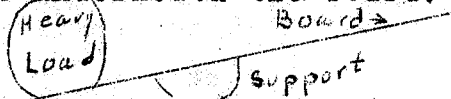

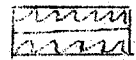
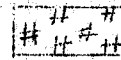
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## SERAPES
