78 ADDITIONAL ELEMENTARY CLASSROOMS NEEDED DURING THE NEXT 5 YEARS BECAUSE:

Birthrate has doubled since 10 years ago.

2340 more pupils will enter elementary schools.

35% increase in elementary school enrollment.

All present elementary classrooms in use; in fact, 31 non-cl class room areas now being used temporarily for classes.

BOND ISSUE WILL INCREASE
TAXES BY 1.2 mills

or

12% per \$100. of assessed valuation, not market value, of property.

4.5 MILLS OPERATING LEVY IS --

2.4 mills Renewal (3 mills were voted in 1949 but reduced to 2.4 as result of general reappraisal of property in 1952)

2.1 mills additional

Levy will increase taxes by 21% per \$100 of valuation

COST OF ISSUES:

The combined cost in taxes of the Bond Issue and Operating Levy will be \$18.15 per year, \$1.50 per month, 38% per week for the average homeowner in Mansfield School District.

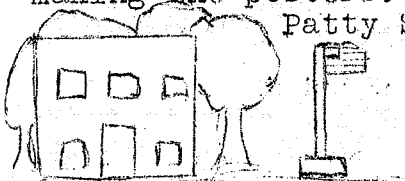
Miss Lindbeck's first grade made speeches about the School Bond Issue and recorded them on a tape recorder.

Mrs. Waldman's first grade has been talking about the Bond issue. They have been making posters. They had a lot of fun making the posters.

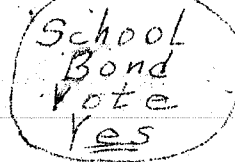

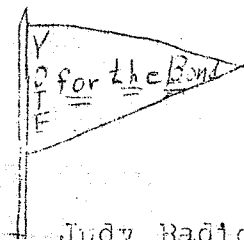

Mrs. Peizer's second grade made badges for the School Bond Issue.



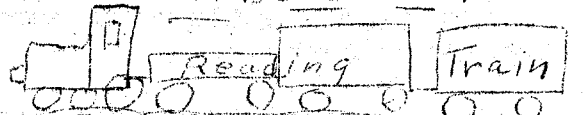

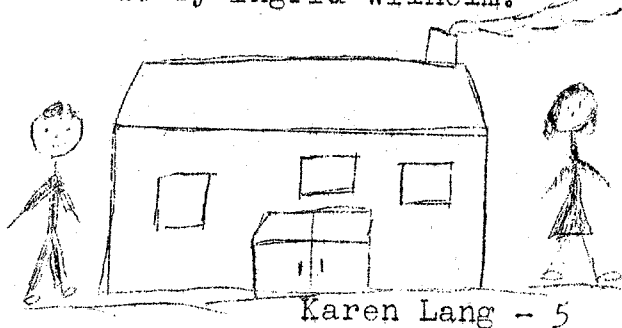

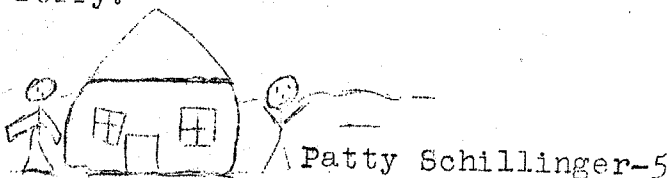
Miss Wolf's fourth grade made up a song to the tune of, "I've Been Working on the Railroad". They also made posters on the Bond Issue.
